Dear Parent/Carer,

We have had a great start to term and are already working hard at our school development priorities – summary to be shared shortly on the website. Pupils have settled down quickly to learning as well as auditioning for Grease our school musical and already getting engaged in sports and other activities. A huge well done to the U13 girls football team who won 8-1 in the first round of the ESFA competition yesterday. We have some amazing sportspeople excelling in local and national squads as well and we are very proud of all of them including Zak, Rhyan, Kitty, Esme and Zachary to name just a few! In the next issue, we will publish some of the fabulous work that the new Year 7s completed over the holiday.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Inside this bulletin is the list of extra-curricular clubs and activities for this term. Some of these are sign up only and you need to follow the guidance attached. We will be reviewing this provision during the year and Mr Langford, who leads this area, will be ensuring that we track pupil participation and ensure all have a chance to get engaged during the year. We hope the new pupil council will also help to shape this offer. We are also looking at using private organisations to help increase what is available and we hope that after half-term there will be more opportunities at a reasonable cost. Pupils should consider a packed lunch if they wish to attend a lunchtime club.

Parent Survey Feedback

I wanted to provide some brief feedback from the survey at the end of last term and thanks to all those who took part. Over 85% of parents who responded agree or strongly agree that their child is happy and safe in school and parents rate the following highly:

Discipline, developing confidence and self-esteem, relationships, school security, communication, choice of subjects and celebrating achievement.

Parents were very clear that they felt communication has improved, as well as opportunities out of the classroom (developing education with character outside the classroom). Parents, along with teachers, find remote parents' evenings preferable, although there was a small group who felt very strongly that this was not the case. As last year, the same proportion of parents who responded felt there was too much homework as to too little and this general debate is currently being played out on Twitter. Most of the areas for development raised by parents are in line with our development priorities and include a continual raising of standards and consistency in the quality of education, reducing staff absence and clearer processes for assessment, both summative (exams etc) and formative (marking and in the classroom). Both will be tackled this year and plans for the former were detailed in the letter earlier this week. We also continue to work at ensuring resources on Google Classroom support independent learning. The vast majority of you (and pupils and staff) are fed up with the building dramas and, as you know, we continue to challenge the local authority to reduce the impact on our pupils and ensure they are on track to complete as soon as they can.

Ofsted Readiness Review

We have received the draft report from the Ofsted Readiness Review and this was the concluding paragraph:

'Under the guidance of the Headteacher and other key senior leaders the school is much improved. Leaders continue to sharpen their strategies so that there is a clear focus on a 'joined-up' approach to strategic leadership in all curriculum areas across the school. Whilst this continues to be a focus, leaders are acutely aware of the areas they are working on for ensuring a seamless quality provision that builds progressively through the key stages. The result of the work of the Headteacher and senior leaders has given rise to an improvement strategy that is intelligent, tough, determined, and vision-orientated for success. It ensures high levels of accountability, sets direction, effectively manages change, and ensures a culture in which learning is the central focus. A positive

learning culture is evident in which staff contribute to this by honing their skills and adapting their strategies accordingly.'

We are never complacent but are pleased the hard work of all staff has been recognised and continue our commitment to ensure this is the best school it can be for our local community.

higher percentage of A*, A*-A, A*-B and A*-C grades when compared to 2019 and at a time where top A Levels in England have gone back to pre-covid levels. We are delighted that the proportion of A*s and As are above national figures.

Headline figures: 28% A*-A grades, 53% A*-B grades, 75% A* -C grades

Huge congratulations to everyone involved and to all our pupils! Headteacher, Emma Hillman, said '*This cohort have had disrupted education over many years and not sat public exams before so we are delighted for each and every one of them and applaud their hard work and resilience.*'

GCSE Level Results 2023

An incredible day at Wanstead High School and we were delighted with the results and the hard work of the Year 11s after so many set-backs and you can only imagine how delighted the pupils were!

There are so many success stories at all levels including grade 9s in all 9 subjects for Anya and 8 & 9 grades for Adam and Luke. Other pupils gained incredible outcomes and 34% of entries were assessed at grades 9-7, compared to a national figures of 22.7%, whilst 82% of entries were graded at 9-4 compared to 67.8% nationally. Maths and English results were outstanding with 70% of pupils achieving a grade 5 or above in Maths and English and 87% a grade 4 in both subjects.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about OF RESTRICTION

Snapchat is an instant messaging app which allows users to send images, videos and texts to people in their friends list. One of Snapchat's unique features is that pictures and messages 'disappear' 24 hours after they've been viewed; however, this content isn't as temporary as many believe – with some users saving screenshots or using another device to take a photo of their screen. This year, Snapchat added 'My Al': a customisable chatbot with which people can chat and share secrets, as well as asking for advice and suggestions of places to visit.

CONNECTING WITH STRANGERS 00

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Even if your child only connects with people they know, they may still get friend requests from strangers. The Quick Add option lets users betriend people the app recommends - but these 'friends' are merely a username, which could have anyone behind it. Accepting such requests reveals children's personal information through the Story, SnapMap and Spotlight features, potentially putting them at risk from predators.

EXCESSINE USE

Snapchat works hard on user engagement, with features like streaks (messaging the same person every day to build up a high score). Spotlight Challenges tempt users into spending time producing content in search of cash prizes and online fame, while it's easy for children to pass hours watching Spotlight's endless scroll of videos. ideos.

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some videos and posts on Snapchat aren't suitable for children. The hashtags used to group content are determined by the poster, so even an innocent search term could still yield age-inappropriate results. The app's 'disappearing messages' feature also makes it easy for young people (teens in particular) to share explicit images on impulse - so sexting continues to be a risk associated with Snapchat. CAUTON

ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

My AI is Snapchat's new chatbot, which replies to questions in a human-like manner. However, the software is still in Its infancy and has significant drawbacks, such as biased, incorrect or misleading responses. There have already been numerous reports of young users turning to AI for medical help and diagnoses, which could be inaccurate and therefore potentially dangerous.

ONLINE PRESSURES

Although many of Snapchat's filters are designed to entertain or amuse, the 'beautify' effects on photos can set unrealistic body-image expectations – creating feelings of inadequacy if a young person compares themselves unfavourably with other users. Snapchat now also has 'priority' notifications (which still get displayed even if a device is in 'do not disturb' mode), increasing the pressure on users to log back in and interact.

VISIBLE LOCATION

Snap Map highlights a device's exact position on a virtual map which is visible to other users. There are options to restrict who can see this information: all friends, only you (Ghost Mode) or selected friends. Snapchat also has real-time location sharing, which is intended as a buddy system to ensure friends have reached home safely – but which could also be used to track a young person for more sinister reasons.

Advice for Parents & Carers

#NOFILTER

TURN OFF QUICK ADD

The Quick Add feature helps people find each other on the app. This function works based on mutual triends or whether sameone's number is in your child's contacts list. Explain to your child that this could potentially make their profile visible to strangers. We recommend that your child turns off Quick Add, which can be done in the settings (accessed via the cog icon).

CHAT ABOUT CONTENT

It may feel like an awkward conversation (and one that young people can be reluctant to have) but it's important to talk apenly and non-judgementally about sexting. Remind your child that once something's online, the creator loses control over where it ends up – and who else sees it. Likewise, it's vital that children understand that some challenges which become popular on the platform may have potentially harmful consequences.

Meet Our Expert

Dr Claire Sutherland is an online safety consultant, educator and researcher who has developed and implemented anti-bullying and cyber safety policies for schools. She has written various academic papers and carried out research for the Australian government comparing internet use and sexting behaviour of young people in the UK, USA and Australia.

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CHOOSE GOOD CONNECTIONS

In 2021, Snapchat rolled out a new safety feature: users can now receive notifications reminding them of the importance of maintaining connections with people they actually know well, as opposed to strangers. This "Friend Check Up" encourages users to delete connections with users that they rarely communicate with, to maintain their online safety and privacy.

KEEP ACCOUNTS PRIVATE

Profiles are private by default, but children may make them public to gain more followers. Snap Stories are visible to everyone your child adds, unless they change the settings. On SnapMaps, their location is visible unless Ghost Mode is enabled (again via settings). It's safest not to add people your child doesn't know in real life – especially since the addition of My Places, which allows other Snapchat users to see where your child regularity visits and checks in.

DISCUSS AI

Although My Al's responses can often give the impression that it's a real person, it's essential that young people remember this certainly isn't the case. Encourage your child to think critically about My Al's replies to their questions: are they accurate and reliable? Remind them that My Al shouldn't replace chatting with their real friends, and that it's always better to talk to an actual person in relation to medical matters.

BE READY TO BLOCK AND REPORT

If a stranger does connect with your child on Snapchat and begins to make them feel uncomfertable through bullying, pressure to send explicit images or by sending sexual images to them, your child can select the three dots on that person's profile and report or block them. There are options to state why they're reporting that user (annoying or malicious messages, spam, or masquerading as someone else, for example).

Item Description

- Jewellery Jewellery worn to school should be safe and appropriate. Pupils may wear up to two small stud earrings in each ear and one small nose stud may also be worn. Hoop or drop earrings of any size are not permitted. No other body or facial piercings should be displayed.
 - Pupils may wear a watch; smart watches are not permitted in exams or assessments.
- Make Up Make-up needs to be subtle and nail varnish can be worn. Heavy make-up, false eyelashes and fake nails are considered inappropriate for school and a distraction from the purpose of school, they are not permitted in Years 7-11.
 - Pupils must wear their hair in a natural colour, bright unnatural colours are not permitted. Extreme hair styles or those associated with any kind of anti-social activities or groups are not permitted. These change from time to time and the Headteacher reserves the right to specify what these might be at any point. The patterned shaving of hair or eyebrows is forbidden.
 - Wanstead High School has adopted the Halo Code. This means our school champions the right of staff and pupils to embrace all Afro-hairstyles. We welcome Afro-textured hair worn in all styles including, but not limited to, afros, locs, twists, braids, cornrows, fades, hair straightened through the application of heat or chemicals, weaves, wigs and headscarves, as long as they are in line with school colours and hair colour guidance. This does not include durags or bonnets which are not appropriate in school.
 - Hooded sports tops or 'hoodies' are not permitted and will be confiscated. Only a black v-neck jumper may be worn in school, this does not have to be logoed. Dance or Drama hoodies are only allowed for extra-curricular activities.
- Balaclavas, It is not permitted for any pupil to wear any form of cap or hat in the school building. A woollen hat can be worn to and from school and at break/lunchtimes when the weather is cold. Ski masks, balaclavas and face coverings should not be worn, to, from or within school.
