- Keep your valuables hidden
- Be aware of your surroundings
- Stay alert – scooters / backpacks
- Earbuds/headphones can be a distraction
- Carry important numbers or share them with a friend

- If someone demands your belongings, don't fight back. Your safety is more important than your possessions.
- Move to a safe place afterwards and tell a trusted adult or call the police as soon as possible.





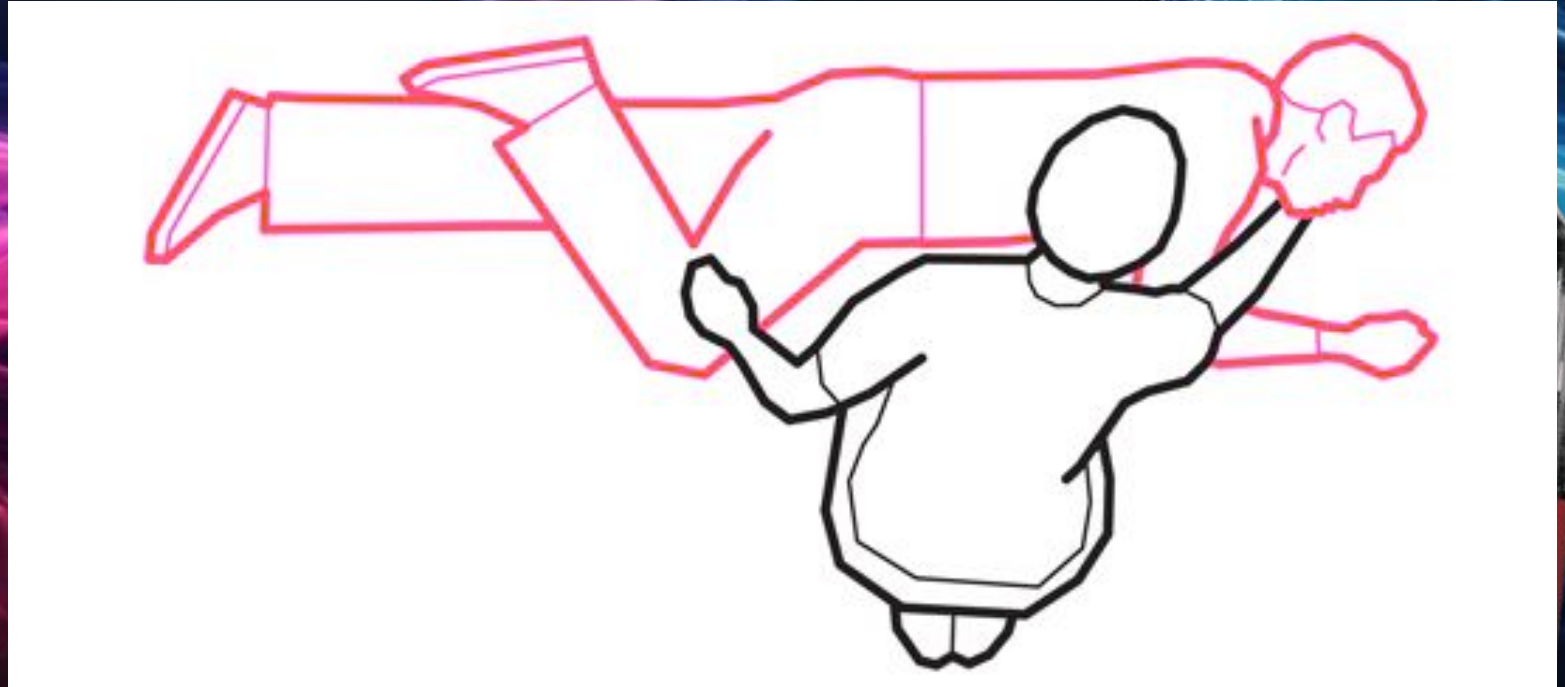
Know your surroundings

Where are you running to?

Where are your places of safety?



- Call 999 immediately and ask for an ambulance
- Immediately phone for an ambulance
- Place them into the recovery position
- Stay with them until the ambulance arrives
- If you know what drug they've taken tell the ambulance crew immediately, it might them get the right treatment faster



Be an Upstander



- Don't laugh
- **Don't participate**
- Stay at a safe distance and help the target get away
- **Don't become an "audience" for the aggressor**
- Help the victim in any way you can
- **Don't film/take pictures of the incident**
- Talk to an adult if you feel support is required



SEXTORTION



- Never send intimate photos or videos, even to someone you think you know.
- People online may pretend to be someone else.
- If someone threatens to share images unless you send money, more pictures or do something for them:
 - Stop communicating.
 - Do not pay or comply.
 - Save the evidence.
 - Block the person.
 - Tell a trusted adult and report it to the police or the platform immediately.
